

Get up to 20% additional points when using PayPay in Kamogawa!

From May 1st to the 30th, you can get extra points toward your PayPay account when using this service at local restaurants and shops.

For example, when paying this way if you spend 1,000 yen:
1,000 yen X 20%= 200 yen in PayPay points.

You can get up to 5,000 yen in points this way. You can not get more than 3,000 yen in points in a single purchase.

Note: You cannot use this system at convenience stores or large supermarkets.

- Please check the PayPay app or look for a campaign poster when trying to use this service to get more points.

How to Use PayPay:

1. Download the app to your phone, and make an account.
2. Use Seven Bank or Lawson Bank to load your account with money.
3. Use the app when making a payment at a store that offers this service.

Notice: Update for Bicycle Users!

Starting July 1st, all bicycle owners and riders will be required to enroll in bicycle insurance. This comes after a change in the prefectural law. This insurance will cover accidents that cause other pedestrians lasting injuries and will also cover accidents the result in death.

The following situations will require insurance enrollment:

- You own and ride a bicycle
- Your company requires that you use a bicycle for work
- You are a company that rents bicycles to others



Note: Minors (people under 17 years old), will have to have their parents enroll on their behalf.

2nd Sunday of the Month: "My Number Card" Pick-up

If you are unable to come to city hall during the week, there will be a chance to pick up your My Number card on the 2nd Sunday of any month. You do not need to make a reservation for this date. It may be busy, so please expect to wait a little while.

NOTE: You can only pick up your card if you have received a notice that your card is ready from the city.

What to bring:

- postcard from the city
- foreign residence card

※If have a citizen identification card or notification card please bring this along when picking up your My Number Card.

Protect your garbage!

Crows, cats, and other animals often rip open garbage bags that have raw garbage and food scraps in them. When you are putting out garbage please be aware of the following steps to prevent your garbage from getting everywhere.

1. Drain the water from raw garbage/food scraps before throwing out
2. Put garbage in the proper disposal box if you have one
3. Use a net to contain garbage bags if there is no disposal box

Recycling Reminder: Glass Containers

Different types of glass containers have different methods for recycling.

Glass bottles used for food, drinks, spices, etc.

- Empty out the bottle
- Rinse or lightly wash the bottle
- Recycle with "Glass Bottle" designated bag on the right day

※Please remove any lids and throw away with either burnable waste or "metals" depending on the lid.

Glass cosmetic containers

Sort with "Glass and Ceramics" and throw away

Broken glass

- Wrap the broken glass in paper
- Write what is inside the wrapping
- Sort with "Glass and Ceramics" and throw away



Medicine and disinfectant containers
