Step 1: Plan your evacuation route!

Use your phone or a computer to access the online disaster prevention map for Kamogawa City. Use this map to plan find evacuation spots near your house, school, work, etc. Also plan an evacuation route in order to avoid potentially dangerous areas.

Step 2: Protect your house!

If you see that heavy rains or strong winds are in the forecast, secure or put away any items that may blow away in the wind. Also, clean gutters and drains around your house to prevent flooding.

Step 3: Prepare for power and water outages!

Have enough food and daily necessities prepared. Check that you get rid of any expired items and buy new items if needed.

Step 4: Evacuate when you feel in danger!

If you hear an announcement from the city announcement system for citizens to evacuate, please evacuate right away if you feel you are in danger.

X If your house seems to be safe enough, you do not have to evacuate! There are still risks of COVID-19 with large groups of people gathering. Please evacuate at home or with a friend/ loved one's if you feel safe.

You can use the gymnasium for free. *Reservation necessary.

Tainoura Boat Tour (04-7095-2318) The fee for the boat tour is free for Kamogawa citizens.

Tanjoji Temple (04-7095-2621) Entry into the treasured Items Sanctuary is free.

X You will have to bring an ID showing your address in Chiba Prefecture, like a driver's license or foreign residence card, to get these discounts.

Important: Changes to Child Allowances in 2022

If you don't have any changes to your family situation you will not have to submit the yearly paperwork that is usually required by the city. If you get this letter please fill it out and return it.

You will have to inform the Child Support Division if you have any of the following changes:

- You are no longer a caregiver for your child.
- If you, your partner, or child change names or addresses
- If you get married while still taking care of your child
- If you get divorced while still taking care of your child
- If your national pension payments change
- If you your partner passes away

Starting from October 2022, people who make over a certain amount of income will no longer be able to receive "Special Benefit" support funds.

This support funding was originally given out to all families. (5,000 yen per child) But, families making enough money will no longer be eligible for this money.

There will be a test around 10AM to simulate an emergency announcement in the case of an earthquake. This is just a test for the alert system so please don't go to any evacuation sites. What/how much to prepare:

- Water: 3L per person, for 3 days
- Food: precooked rice, alpha rice, canned foods, cup noodles, etc.
- Daily necessities: toilet paper, portable gas stove (with gas), etc.
- Emergency goods: flashlight, lantern, etc.
