




Dogs

November 15 (Sat.) to February 15 (Sun.)

Hunters engaging in hunting wild animals use firearms. When going to the mountains: Wear red, orange or bright colored clothes and make sure to turn your radio on.

Applications are required when burning grass in rice paddies and fields.

In winter, when the wind is strong and the air is dry, fires are more likely to start.

If you wish to burn grass in your field, please apply at the Kamogawa Fire Department and Agriculture, Forestry, and Fishing Division.

- I. Do not do it alone.
- 2. Cut the surrounding grass. (to prevent fire from spreading)
- 3. Prepare fire extinguishing tools to put out the fire when it spreads.
- 4. Prevent on doing it on a strong windy day.
- 5. Be cautious and inform your neighbors when you plan to burn grass or rice straws.
