June 2nd~10th - Manitowoc Musical Group Delegation, The Neustadters to Kamogawa

July 9th~14th - Manitowoc City Hall Dedication Ceremony

During a Kamogawa City Employee Delegation to Manitowoc, Mayor Honda, KIRA President Sakai, Vice President Karikomi and fourteen other members of the delegation attend the Manitowoc City Hall Dedication and present Manitowoc with a "maiwai" (traditional Kamogawa cloth painting).

July 20th ~ Aug. 6th - Student Exchange Program

Six Manitowoc students and six Kamogawa students visit the facilities of Kamogawa and Manitowoc, respectively. While staying with host families, student learn about history and culture of sister city.

Jan. 5th~24th - Manitowoc Children's Art Exhibition

Works of art by Manitowoc's youth are exhibited with ones by Kamogawa students.

Oct. 24th~27th - Manitowoc Student Art Exhibition

Thirty works of art by Manitowoc students are displayed along with artworks of Kamogawa students on the 4th floor of Kamogawa Flore.

Nov. 3rd~5th - 31st Annual Culture Day Exhibition at Civic Hall

February - Friendship City Delegation Visit to Sanya, China.

To examine the possibilities of expanding on the friendship city relations with Sanya city, 21 delegates from Kamogawa visit Sanya to visit public facilities and businesses. Delegates also visit Sanya city government and hold a question/answer session to learn more about each other's city.

July - Student Exchange Program

July - Five Manitowoc High School Students Visit Kamogawa

While participating on a homestay, students visit Niemonjima Island and the Japanese Air Self-Defense Force Mineokayama Sub Base, and learn about the history and culture of Kamogawa.

August - Six Kamogawa Jr. High and High School Students Visit Manitowoc

Students visit Rahr-West Art Museum, Lincoln Zoo, observe Japanese gardening techniques, and exchange culture through a homestay.

November - 34th Annual Culture Day Exhibition

Twenty-two paintings from Manitowoc children are displayed with cultural works form Kamogawa Citizens.

2005

March - Manitowoc Student Art Exhibition

Winning pieces from Kamogawa elementary and middle school students are displayed with works by Manitowoc elementary students in the Kamogawa Civic Gallery.

July - Six Manitowoc High School Students Visit Kamogawa

Manitowoc students learn about Kamogawa history and Japanese culture during a nine day homestay by experiencing first hand Japanese martial arts and the art of making traditional rice treats.

August - Six Kamogawa Jr. High and High School Students Visit Manitowoc

Kamogawa students, during their homestay, participate in a pizza party as well as cookie making. They get to exchange culture with some of the youth from Manitowoc as well as experience daily life.

November - 35th Annual Culture Day Exhibition

Thirty paintings by Manitowoc children are displayed in Kamogawa.

December - Manitowoc Student Art Exhibition

Thirty paintings from Manitowoc children are displayed with 74 paintings from Kamogawa elementary and middle school students in the Kamogawa Civic Gallery.

2006

July - Six Manitowoc Jr. High and High School Students Visit Kamogawa

During their homestay, Manitowoc students learn about the history of Kamogawa and Japanese culture by visiting Tanjoji Temple, observing the Oyama rice terrace establishments, and participating in Nagasa High School club activities.

August - Six Kamogawa Jr. High and High School Students Visit Manitowoc
