June's Topic: Pet Care and Rules

June is the month for learning how to raise animals. Animals share the same right to live as humans. Let's take this month to learn how to live in cooperation with our animals companions.

For dog owners, make sure that your dog is always wearing a collar that indicates that it is up to date on its rabies vaccinations. **Law requires that your dog is registered and vaccinated.**

Make sure you are prepared to evacuate with all of your owned animals in an emergency situation

In the unfortunate event that you are unable to continue raising an animal, please try to find it a new home. Animal shelters and insurance places should be able to help your search.

Abandoning or animals in your care can result in heavy fines (Up to 1,000,000 yen) and even worse, killing an animal can result in 2 years in jail and a 2,000,000 yen fine
