

Throwing away appliances with CFCs

The following are some examples of household appliances that Kamogawa Garbage Center will not accept for disposal due to them containing CFC (chlorofluorocarbons):

Examples: Dehumidifiers, Air Conditioners, Water Coolers, Air Purifiers with Dehumidification functions ...etc.

※ Businesses/Business owners who have a certificate showing that they have properly taken care of CFCs in a given appliance can bring their items to the Garbage Center with their certification.

Note: When throwing away appliances and toys that use batteries, take out all batteries before disposal and throw away the batteries in an appropriate location.



LET'S RIDE! KAMOGAWA PUBLIC TRANSPORT

For people without cars or who can't drive, getting around the city to shop or go to the hospital can be quite difficult. However, Kamogawa's public transportation systems can make it easier for people in this situation to get around.

These services are quite convenient but are at risk of being reduced due to low ridership. Please make use of public transport at your leisure!

Reminders when riding public transportation:

- Wear a mask when riding
- Use the hand sanitizer provided before getting on

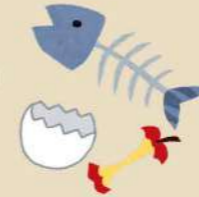
REMINDER! SORTING GARBAGE...

Raw Garbage

- Remove as much water as you can from raw garbage before throwing out. Throwing out raw garbage that hasn't been properly taken care of, like food scraps, can attract birds and animals.
- If possible, turn your raw garbage into compost to help reduce the amount waste you are getting rid of.

Underwear, Socks, Hats, Bags

- Throw out the above clothing items with combustible garbage.
- Underwear cannot be recycled or sold.



Umbrellas

- When throwing away an umbrella, remove the cloth or vinyl part and throw it out with combustible garbage.
- Throw the remaining frame away with "Metal" garbage.



Styrofoam Items

- Clean off all trays and items before throwing out.
- Large trays and other items should be tied up with a string before throwing out.
- Smaller trays and things that can't be tied up should be put in a green recycling bag and thrown out.
- Colored or patterned Styrofoam and items that can't be cleaned should be thrown out with combustibles.

Spray Cans

- Completely empty out spray cans before throwing them out with "Empty Can" garbage.
