4 The 2020 Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games (July/ August)
The Olympic torch came to Kamogawa during a ceremony
featuring Kamogawa's own, Kunezaki Katsumi. The women's soccer
team from the Netherlands also paid a visit to Kamogawa. Students
from Saijo participated in making the ceremonial Paralympic fire.



- 5 Completion of the *Kiyosumi sando* Loop Bridge. (September)
 This years-long project finished with a disaster-proofed road leading to Kamogawa's Kiyosumi and Yomogi area.
- 6 800th Anniversary of Holy Priest Nichiren's birthday. (February) Tanjoji Temple and the surrounding area celebrated the birthday with a variety of events.



- 7 The renewal of the city homepage. (August/September)
 This was accompanied by the development of a city LINE account.
- 8 Josai International University starts talks with the city about what to do with their land and facilities after they close their doors.
- 9 Kominato Satoumi School finished construction. (August) This will be a facility that can be used for events and sports-related projects from now on.
- 10 The Maebara Yokosuka beach area will start a revitalization project to bring in more visitors to Kamogawa. (December)

Be careful of Norovirus

Norovirus is a virus that flares up during the winter months and is usually passed through undercooked shellfish. It can pass from person to person very easily as well. People with weakened immune systems, young children, and the elderly may also have very severe reactions to this virus. The virus stays in your system for 1-2 days and may cause vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain, a small fever, among other symptoms.

Ways to prevent Norovirus:

- 1 Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water. Hand sanitizer has little effect on norovirus.
- 2 If you are worried, do not eat raw shellfish. When cooking, cook meat until it has an internal temperature of between 85-90°C for at least 90 seconds.
- 3 Norovirus is easily passed through bodily fluid/waste. If you are taking care of someone or have to clean a toilet or other space used by someone with norovirus be extra careful. Use Hypocholorite Nitrium Sanitizer 「次亜塩素酸ナトリウム消毒液」 when cleaning.
